- Could serve as first phase of a foundation for comprehensive repositioning of city as whole & further re-establish as a destination for wide range of household types
- Since Neighborhood Plus was adopted by the City Council October 2015, Dallas has changed its approach to housing development from citywide



policy-based framework planning to neighborhood-level implementation
